

Your employment with the R.C.M.P. Security Service requires a "TOP SECRET" security clearance and the process, including full field investigation, was explained to you during the security interview. You were, in fact, issued a "SECRET" security clearance and hired on the strength of this pending the results of the field security investigation.

The field investigation, confirmed by your behaviour while on the job, has identified you as a homosexual and the Force's position, in line with Cabinet Directive #35, precludes the issuance of a security clearance to such a level to persons of this sexual persuasion. Homosexuality is an identified reliability weakness identified in aforementioned government guideline.

I must inform you that your security clearance is immediately reduced to the level of "CONFIDENTIAL" which, of course, precludes your employment in any area of the R.C.M.P. Security Service.
