Diary Date

1. At the request of SP 1252 Major Donald Carter MACMILLAN, the Commanding Officer, 1 Wks Coy, RCE, LONDON, Ont. an investigation was made into the activities of [redacted] of that unit, with regard to his association with children at HAGERSVILLE Army Camp, HAGERSVILLE, Ont.
2. Enquiries in the LONDON area brought to light a complaint from [redacted] a civilian employee of 1 Wks Coy RCE, regarding [redacted] conduct with her son, [redacted] aged 12 yrs.
3. At 2200 hrs, 11 Apr 60, I interviewed [redacted] at his home, [redacted] LONDON, Ont, in the presence of his mother. [redacted] had travelled to TORONTO, Ont, twice with [redacted] at weekends to stay with his grandmother. This arrangement had been made between [redacted] and [redacted].
4. At 2225 hrs, [redacted] made a statement in which he said that on each trip [redacted] had told him to unbutton his pants fly and had then played with his privates. This took place both travelling to and returning from TORONTO. [redacted] had told him at each time to stop. The first trip was made in late November 59, and the second in January 60. The boy had been told by [redacted] not to mention these incidents to either his mother or grandmother.
5. On 13 Apr 60, accompanied by EU 6047 Capt John RAND, Area Provost Marshal, W Ont Area. I visited 1 VSD, HAGERSVILLE, Ont. Enquiries revealed that [redacted] had been on very friendly terms with a [redacted] son of [redacted] RCOO, 27 GSD 1 VSD, HAGERSVILLE, Ont.
6. At 1400 hrs, 13 Apr 60, [redacted] was interviewed and made a statement in which he said that [redacted] became friendly with his eldest son [redacted] when he was fifteen years of age. [redacted] had gone to TORONTO with [redacted] for the weekend several times and in the summer of 59 had made a ten day trip to the Maritimes with him. [redacted] had bought [redacted] several presents, among them a set of trap drums worth approx \$200.00, a transistor radio, value approx \$40.00, and given him various sums of money. (Statement attached as Annex 'B')
7. [redacted] gave me his permission to talk to his son saying that he would talk to me more readily than in his father's presence.
8. At 1500 hrs, 13 Apr 60, [redacted] 16 yrs, of [redacted] HAGERSVILLE Army Camp, HAGERSVILLE, Ont, was interviewed and made a statement. [redacted] said that he was a very good friend of [redacted] who had visited him several times since he had

been posted back to LONDON. When he had gone to TORONTO with [redacted] they had slept together as they did on the trip to the EAST coast. [redacted] had played with his penis when out in the car, at the drive - in theatres, and when they slept together. (Statement attached as Annex 'G')

9. At 0930 hrs, 18 Apr 60, I arrested [redacted] informed him of the offences he had committed. I asked him if the statements made by [redacted] and [redacted] were true and in the presence of SA 125743 Cpl CAVERS, William Thomas, and myself, he said they were. [redacted] declined to make a statement and at 1020 hrs 18 Apr 60, was placed in the 2 RCR Guardroom, Wolseley Barracks, LONDON, Ont. awaiting disposal. (Statement attached as Annex 'D')

10. [redacted] was posted to HAGERSVILLE on 9 Jan 59 and recalled to LONDON on 29 Jun 59. He was until January of this year a frequent visitor to HAGERSVILLE Army Camp. While stationed there he was constantly driving children around in his car but it is not known whether or not any other child was approached by him as was [redacted]

11. [redacted] would appear to be wholly receptive to this kind of behaviour and evinced no shame or guilt.

12. It is respectfully suggested that this investigation be considered concluded by this Detachment unless otherwise instructed.
