1. On the 26 MAY 60, acting on the instructions of the Garrison Provost Marshal, Headquarters Calgary Garrison, and on information received from ZF 586 Major Donald Martin CREIGHTON, Commanding Officer, QOR of C Depot, an investigation was opened into an alleged morals offence, involving two (2) members of that unit.

2. The following information was obtained from a report submitted by [redacted] QOR of C Depot:-

a. At about 2315 hrs, 22 MAY 60, [redacted] no 86 Platoon, was having a shower in the quarters in Building B - 7, and [redacted] also of no 86 Platoon, volunteered to wash his back, immediately after which he handled [redacted] s testicles and masturbated him.

b. [redacted] later mentioned this incident to another member of the platoon and it soon became general knowledge. Plans were then made by members of the platoon, to set a trap for [redacted].

c. [redacted] who became suspicious that something was about to happen to him, reported his fears to [redacted] QOR of C Depot Orderly Sergeant. A statement obtained from [redacted] is attached as Annex "A".

3. At 1530 hrs, 26 MAY 60, [redacted] was interviewed at the Calgary Provost Section Office, but denied the incident.

4. [redacted] was interviewed at 1650 hrs, 26 MAY 60, and after being cautioned, made a statement in which he repeated the allegation. See Annex "B".

5. In view of [redacted] s denial, and that the only evidence available was that of [redacted] a request was made through the Area Provost Marshal, Alberta Area, for a check of [redacted] s civilian and previous service record. [redacted] had served five (5) years in the RCN and was released on 28 SEP 59. This check met with negative results.

6. On 8 JUN 60, at about 1010 hrs, [redacted] was interviewed by the Garrison Provost Marshal, [redacted] and [redacted] then added to his previous statement, by admitting that he took an active part in the incident and stating that while [redacted] was masturbating him, he in turn masturbated [redacted]. See Annex "C".

7. At about 1100 hrs, 8 JUN 60, [redacted] was re-interviewed. After considerable questioning, during which he emphatically denied the incident, it was suggested that if the allegation made against him was correct, a psychiatrist interview may help him. He then asked of what assistance a psychiatrist could be, and when told, he admitted the allegation that they both masturbated each other, but refused to make a written statement or to discuss the matter any further.

8. Maj CREIGHTON was informed of the results of this investigation at 1145 hrs, 8 JUN 60, and it was suggested that both men be referred to the medical authorities.

9. In view of the foregoing and unless otherwise instructed, this report will be considered concluded.
