1. At about 1330 hours 7 Nov 60 [redacted] 2 RCR, LONDON, Ontario reported to this office that it had come to his attention that [redacted] of 2 RCR was involved in a homosexual relationship with a person who was believed to be an RCAF Officer.

2. The RCAF, SID, LONDON, Ontario was advised of this matter and a joint investigation was initiated by myself and 210440 Sgt CUTTING Ralph Arthur of that unit.

3. At 1500 hours 7 Nov 60 we interviewed [redacted] of 2 RCR. [redacted] stated that while on scheme in WEAPORD, Ontario in October 1960 he overheard a conversation between his driver, [redacted], and another soldier which led him to believe that [redacted] had committed several acts of gross indecency with an RCAF Officer.

4. At about 0930 hours 8 Nov 60 [redacted] was interviewed. [redacted] stated that about two years ago [redacted] was engaged in an unsavoury relationship with an RCAF Officer. [redacted] disclaimed any first hand knowledge of the matter and stated that all he knew was what he had been told by [redacted] and other persons. He stated that a man in RCAF uniform was once pointed out to him in a local cocktail lounge as [redacted]'s girlfriend.

5. At about 1100 hours 8 Nov 60 [redacted] was interviewed. After some preliminary questioning he was cautioned and a statement obtained which is attached as Annex "A". [redacted] stated that in May 1958 he met an RCAF Officer named [redacted] in the beverage room of the Clarendon Hotel in LONDON. Later that same day he went with [redacted] to the Officer's Quarters at RCAF Station CENTRALIA, Ontario. While in the Officer's Quarters [redacted] performed an act of fellatio upon him. About two months later he again met [redacted] and again went with him to CENTRALIA where the gross indecency was repeated. [redacted] stated that he last saw [redacted] on Dundas Street in LONDON during the Spring of 1960.

6. [redacted] described [redacted] as follows:

- a. Height: [redacted]
- b. Weight: Approximately [redacted] pounds.
- c. Hair: [redacted]
- d. Clothing: Wore an RCAF battledress with pilot's wings and one or two stripes on the spaulds.

6. e. General: Spoke with an English inflection. Stated that he was a flying instructor at CENTRALIA and that he also taught English. Claimed to have spent some time in England and to have a university degree in psychology.

7. [redacted] stated that when he first met [redacted] his car was a blue or black late model Chrysler and that the second time he went to CENTRALIA with him he was driving a grey DKW.

8. At about 1500 hours 8 Nov 60 a patrol was made to RCAF Station CENTRALIA where it was discovered that [redacted] served at that Station from April 1956 until he was released from the RCAF on 26 Nov 58. [redacted] is now employed as a civilian instructor in the Primary Training School at RCAF Station CENTRALIA.

9. Discreet enquiries among acquaintances of [redacted] produced the following information:

F. C. R.

- a. [redacted] speaks with an [redacted]
- b. He is a [redacted] man of [redacted] with [redacted]
- c. While in the Service he was a flying instructor.
- d. He is and was an English language instructor.
- e. He at one time owned a DKW car.
- f. Prior to and for several months following his release he lived in the Officer's Quarters.

10. At 1030 hours 10 Nov 60 seven CAPIB photographs, including one of [redacted], were displayed to [redacted]. [redacted] was asked the following questions: "Do you recognize any of the men pictured in these photographs as the person known to you as [redacted]? If so indicate the photograph by touching it." [redacted] unhesitatingly indicated the photograph of [redacted].

11. The Commanding Officer of RCAF Station CENTRALIA, Supt C/O AG KENYON, has been advised of this matter and states that, although he no longer has disciplinary jurisdiction over [redacted] he will take action to have him dismissed from his employment.

12. In view of the lapse of time since the offences were committed and the subsequent change in [redacted]'s status it is considered that further investigation will serve no useful purpose.
