1 On 21 Jan 66 this detachment received a telephone call from 18438 F/O E McCarthy, PA20, Stn Alaskan Sask, on behalf of the Commanding Officer of that unit, advising that an alleged overture of homosexuality was to have been made to a unit airman by a unit Corporal. Investigative assistance was requested as per CAFMO C19,00/17. F/O McCarthy added that a letter with a formal request for investigative assistance had been prepared, with an appropriate distribution list, and would be mailed on that date.

2 As arranged Cpl LE Neeson, AFW/EMD, and the writer arrived at Stn Alaskan on 25 Jan 66. 212090 Sgt FW Wiese, NCO1/e AFW, who had initiated the investigation, was first interviewed. Sgt Wiese explained that on 19 Jan 66 while engaged in a casual conversation with [redacted] and [redacted] the topic of homosexuals came about. At this point [redacted] remarked (statement attached as app A) that he knew a man on the unit who had recently been propositioned. On discussing this remark further Sgt Wiese learned that [redacted] employed on the unit as Crypto Op, was alleged to have made an overture of this type to [redacted].

As a result of this information Sgt Wiese pursued the matter further. In agreement with the PA20, Sgt Wiese and 44129 Cpl JD Hieslop, NCO1A, interviewed [redacted]'s general account was that while attending a house party at the home of [redacted] GenTech(0), PWQ 37, he had been engaged in conversation by [redacted] which dealt with the topic of [redacted] being a quiet, nice fellow that [redacted] had a nice "build" and the loving of fellow men. From this part of the conversation [redacted] was to have extended [redacted] an invitation to come to his barrack room where no one would bother them. There they could strip to the "buff" and he could satisfy [redacted] was to have made additional remarks such as girls hold no interest for me and you'll have to help me as I can not do it myself. A time and date were then set for the following day, 1500 hrs 2 Jan 66, where [redacted] would visit [redacted] in the BB room. [redacted] had added that at first he had not realized what [redacted] was referring to but later decided to go along with the conversation and find out just how far [redacted] would carry the matter. After this incidence [redacted] claimed that he informed the remaining eight people or so at the party of this discussion. [redacted] continued that about a week later he met [redacted] in the Airman's Club where [redacted] confided that he, [redacted], had been "that way" since a childhood experience. Further that he, [redacted] had never approached an airman before and while overseas he had dealt strictly with Europeans. [redacted] indicated that part of this letter conversation in the Airman's Club was to have been also related by [redacted] to [redacted]. On the basis of this Sgt Wiese asked [redacted] to write down as detailed an account as possible of his conversations with [redacted] prepared an account and handed it to Sgt Wiese the following day. A copy of this account is attached as app B.

3 Sgt Wiese continued that immediately following his interview with [redacted] he had questioned [redacted]'s version corroborated [redacted]'s statements. Because of the strong allegation Sgt Wiese suspended any further enquiries should they hamper or interfere with an SID investigation.

4 Following the receipt of Sgt Wiese's information, the principal airman's records were checked. The following particulars were noted:

Neither of the above airmen had anything on their medical documents  
of relevance to this investigation.

5 On 26 Jan 66 at about 1300 hrs [redacted] was contacted  
at home and brought to the unit guardhouse where he was interviewed.  
During this interview it was noted that [redacted] appeared to emotionally  
show a higher degree of disturbance than normally expected under  
the circumstances. Further [redacted]'s reiterations of his initial  
accounts were being continually modified and disorientated. Eventually  
he requested to be interviewed by one person and at this point stated  
that he had not told the complete truth. [redacted] stated that he  
himself had been guilty to a limited degree in the incident. [redacted]  
went on that he in fact had responded to [redacted]'s overtures and  
had felt excitement because of these advances. In addition he had not

told anyone of [redacted]'s proposal that same evening and that it was not till about the 2/3 Jan 66 when he had first mentioned it to [redacted]. On the night of the proposal he had seriously thought of keeping the arranged appointment however on thinking the matter over he decided against it. He said that eventually the thought of becoming implicated in a homosexual act repulsed him. As a result of this he had become quite concerned with himself to a point where he began to wonder if he was in fact homosexually inclined. Because of this he confided, to a limited degree, in [redacted] on the 2 or 3 Jan 66. As [redacted] appeared to have difficulty in giving a verbal explanation he was asked if he would prefer to make a written account. He indicated that he would and commenced to write at 1520 hrs completing the account at 1745 hrs. This account is attached as app G. It may be noted that during this interview [redacted] had indicated that he was concerned with himself to a degree whereby he wished medical attention.

6 As [redacted] was away on TD till 28 Jan 66 and could not be immediately interviewed it was decided to interview [redacted]. At 1950 hrs 26 Jan 66 [redacted] was brought to the guardhouse from his barrack room 1171 [redacted] has changed rooms since 1 Jan 66). While in the process of an explanation as to why he had been brought to the guardhouse [redacted] interrupted with a statement "Oh I know what it's all about - [redacted] - I thought it was a joke. He came up to me in the kitchen and said are you a queer and I said sure! Are you one too? He then said when can I see you and I replied anytime I live alone in room 224 or something like that to which he said how about three to-morrow afternoon. I just thought it a joke." At this point [redacted] was made fully aware that the allegation was no joke, asked to take his time and give his version, in as much detail as possible, of the events on the night in question. His reply was that he had drank a considerable amount on that date and his recollections were limited. He then followed with a very vague and generalised account. On further interrogation [redacted] became more specific and acute in his recollection but would not offer any further information than that directly asked for. After the interview [redacted] was offered an opportunity to make his account in writing. His statement in respect of his allegation is attached as app D.

7 On 27 Jan 66 [redacted] was reinterviewed. During this interview [redacted] again modified his claim that the alleged advances by [redacted] had taken place over two meetings in the kitchen, at this time claiming that they had in fact taken place over three separate meetings. On the initial meeting [redacted] claimed that he was just standing in the kitchen door way when [redacted] approached him, felt his arm and complimented him on his fine "build" and such. A short time later the two met in the kitchen again where the conversation had evolved on brotherly love and [redacted] was to have extended the invitation to his room. On the third meeting [redacted] claimed that he was returning from the bathroom, passing through the kitchen, when [redacted] met him near the stove, took [redacted]'s hands in his and was to have stated "I'm dripping do you believe me? etc." Shortly after this meeting [redacted] stated that he left the party. It could not be established whether [redacted] did in fact mention this incident to [redacted] prior to leaving the party or not.

8 During the interviews of ██████████ and ██████████ both had claimed that they had not met each other, that is on a conversational basis, until 1 Jan 66. They had seen each other at the Airmen's Club on one or two occasions but had never introduced themselves. However it was noted during ██████████'s interview that ██████████ had a considerable amount of knowledge about ██████████'s background. When asked where and how he had attained this information ██████████ stated that he had looked at ██████████'s records R33L. His explanation was that he likes to know about people as to where they come from, what their full names are and such. He attributed this to his natural curiosity, and that he is in the habit of finding out about people. ██████████ claimed that he had looked at ██████████'s records after 1 Jan 66.

9 As ██████████ had indicated that ██████████ was in the kitchen talking to ██████████ during a minor portion of ██████████'s second conversation with ██████████ was interviewed. Aves stated that he just vaguely recalled having conversed with ██████████ in the kitchen but could not say whether there had been any one else present in the kitchen at the time or not. ██████████ continued that at this particular time he and ██████████ were either refilling their drinks or helping themselves to the food laid out buffet style. He was unable to contribute anything of value which would have furthered this investigation.

10 At about 2045 hrs on 27 Jan 66 ██████████ returned from TD at Great Falls Montana USA. He was immediately interviewed. In brief his account was that on 1 Jan 66, during the party, ██████████ had told him of ██████████'s proposal but he had passed it off as an insignificant remark. About a week later while in the Airmen's Club with ██████████ and two or three other couples he saw ██████████ talking to ██████████ at the bar. As he noticed that ██████████ had a disgusted look on his face he walked up to ██████████ and told him to leave alone as ██████████ wasn't his type. At this point ██████████ was to have stated "You know about this too" and proceeded to confide in ██████████ - that he(██████████) had been that way for a long time; that he(██████████) could get into real trouble if this got around; and that he(██████████) wanted to live like other normal people. ██████████'s written account is attached as app E.

11 It is pointed out that following ██████████'s interview his room and belongings were searched. There was nothing of a significant nature to substantiate or indicate that ██████████ held homosexual interests. There was only one magazine "Sir", March issue no year indicated, which contained a questionnaire designed to evaluate yourself as to homosexual tendencies. Remaining literature was of the average standard. Attached as app F is a list of names copied from ██████████'s address book.

12 On 28 Jan 66 the matter was discussed with the unit P40 and, with the concurrence of the Commanding Officer, ██████████ would be referred for a medical examination. Stn Alaskan would arrange for this medical examination with the SMO at RCAF Stn Cold Lake. It was felt that such an examination would assist in the evaluation of ██████████'s allegation.

Except for [redacted] discussion with [redacted] at the Airmans Club most of the information supplied by him was received from [redacted].
