- Further to our initial report of even file dated 24 Mar 66. On the 7 Apr 66, [redacted] MSM Tech was re-interviewed.
- The purpose of this interview was to clarify certain points regarding any possible relationship [redacted] might have had with [redacted] MSM Tech Stn St Hubert and [redacted] Stn St Hubert and [redacted] SE Tech, Stn Val D'Or.
- Further to para 12 of the original report, [redacted] stated that although [redacted] had been on Temporary Duty at Stn Val D'Or during the same period as [redacted] MSM Tech, there had not been any homosexual relationship between himself and [redacted].
- Further to para 4 (e) of the original report, [redacted] advised that although he had attempted to commit a homosexual act with [redacted] in the Continental Hotel, North Bay, Ont, in Oct 65 his advances had been rebuffed by [redacted].
- Further to para 15 of the original report, [redacted] stated that when he was introduced to [redacted] by [redacted] at St Hubert in Mar 66, he had been previously informed by [redacted] that [redacted] was homosexual. [redacted] had further informed [redacted] that [redacted] had made homosexual advances towards [redacted]. [redacted] advised that there was not any homosexual relationship between [redacted] and himself.
- Paras 8(f) and 13 of the original report deals with [redacted]'s homosexual relationship with [redacted] MSE Op. 1 [redacted] reiterated that a homosexual act had taken place between [redacted] and himself at the Empire Hotel, Val D'Or, PQ.
- Upon re-interview [redacted] again denied any involvement with [redacted]. [redacted] stated in the presence of [redacted] and the investigators that the homosexual act had taken place. [redacted] was agitated and declined to make any further statements either denying or admitting the act.
- During the interview with [redacted] he realized that he was being released and his RCAF career was terminated. He talked quite freely and in the opinion of the investigators, truthfully. He stated he had supplied the names of all persons with whom he had been involved and could add nothing further.

9. On the 7 Apr 66, [redacted] FF, was interviewed regarding remarks passed by [redacted], MSE Op, to [redacted] para 24 of the original report refers. [redacted] stated that on the night in question he met [redacted] and [redacted] in Val D'Or, PQ. They decided to return to Stn Val D'Or and took a taxi to [redacted]'S residence and continued to the Unit in [redacted]'S PMC. [redacted] substantiated in essence that [redacted] had passed the remark that he did not want to be left alone with [redacted]. [redacted] further stated that he had heard rumours that [redacted] was a homosexual. [redacted] surmised that this was the reason [redacted] did not want to be left alone with [redacted]. [redacted] could not offer any further information nor could he identify the sources of the rumours alleging that [redacted] was a homosexual.

10. On the 7 Apr 66, [redacted] was re-interviewed and he maintained that there had never been any homosexual activities between himself and [redacted]. [redacted] could not or would not offer any explanation for his apparent fear of being left alone with [redacted]. From [redacted]'S general manners and speech it is the opinion of the investigators that [redacted] was not telling the truth and that [redacted] had made homosexual advances towards him or had carried out homosexual acts with [redacted].

11. [redacted] advised that when he and [redacted] had continued on their leave, after being returned to Stn Val D'Or, they proceeded to Montreal, PQ. They attended a dance at Stn St Hubert and had talked with [redacted] who was employed as a cloak room attendant. [redacted] advised that he informed [redacted] of his knowledge of this investigation. [redacted] remarked that there was no evidence against him. [redacted] was further described as being active in sport and the Boy Scout movement.

12. At 1400 hrs, 12 Apr 66, W/C DAB SMILEY, CO, RCAF Stn Val D'Or, PQ, telephoned this office advising that [redacted] was dissatisfied with a transfer to Stn Cold Lake, Alta and now wished to discuss this case with the investigators. W/C SMILEY stated that [redacted] had passed remarks to the effect that he would do anything to get out of this transfer and the service, including damaging an aircraft. W/C SMILEY was under the impression that [redacted] would supply further information to this investigation.

13. At 1630 hrs, 12 Apr 66, [redacted] was re-interviewed. At the commencement of the interview [redacted] asked various questions in such a manner as to imply that if he provided information implicating himself he would gain his release from the service. It was pointed out to [redacted] that the investigators would not bargain with him and any information he provided would be on a voluntary basis.

14. The following question and answer was received from
[redacted]

Q1 What do you mean by, "blowing me," or "blown me?"

A1 The guy went down and sucked me off.

15. As can be noted from the statement [redacted] confirmed
what had been previously learned and he did not provide any
additional information.

16. On the 12 Apr 66, [redacted]
MSE Op was re-interviewed regarding his knowledge of
[redacted] stated that he had heard rumours that
[redacted] was believed to be a homosexual. As a result of these
rumours [redacted] had requested that he be removed from [redacted] S
crew. [redacted] also stated that [redacted] and [redacted], MSE Ops,
possessed information regarding [redacted] advised
that [redacted]'S wife had remarked, while attending parties,
that her husband was not much good to her in that he was sexually
incompetent, referred to other males as being sexually superior
and had made advances towards a waiter in a local hotel while in
the presence of her husband and several other persons. [redacted]
from her own remarks was deemed to have been involved with
[redacted] an American Negro, who at one time played with a band
in the Val D'Or area. This person was previously commented upon
in reports [redacted] dated 17 Feb 65 para 28 refers.

17. [redacted] MSE Op
was interviewed on the 12 Apr 66. [redacted] advised that he had
been stationed at RCAF Stn Mont Apica with [redacted] for
approximately six months in 1959 or 1960 and he has known [redacted]
at Stn Val D'Or from Jul 64 to the present time. During these
periods of time he has heard [redacted] referred to as a
homosexual. [redacted] could not identify the sources of this
information and advised that these remarks would be passed at
times when [redacted] would enter the Airmen's Club.

18. [redacted]
MSE Op was interviewed on the 12 Apr 66 and he could not supply
any information.

19. The results of the interviews conducted by S/L P GAMACHE, Med/MD with personnel involved or suspected of being involved in homosexual activities on strength at Stn Val D'Or were made known to the investigators. The diagnosis and recommendations are shown hereunder;

a. [redacted] - DIAGNOSIS - Sexual Deviation (Homosexuality) RECOMMENDATION - Administrative release in accordance with CAFAC C1900/17.

b. [redacted] - DIAGNOSIS - Sexual Deviation (Homosexuality) RECOMMENDATION - Administrative release in accordance with CAFAC C1900/17.

c. [redacted] - REMARKS - One cannot conclude that he is guilty but without being a true homosexual it would not be out of keeping with his personality for him to try it for kicks. DIANOSIS - Inadequate personality RECOMMENDATION - N/A

d. [redacted] - REMARKS - More problems of personality than sexuality. He is a loner who does not mix freely. A target for homosexuals and attracts them. DIANOSIS - Passive - Dependent Personality RECOMMENDATION - N/A


e. [redacted] - DIAGNOSIS - Sexual Deviation (Homosexuality) RECOMMENDATION - Unfit for HRP, Administrative release reference CFMD 26.11(26) and CAFAC C1900/17, to be admitted to NDMC prior to release for psychiatric treatment.


20. S/L GAMACHE described the pornographic literature found in [redacted] possession (para 19 original report refers) as being literature which would be read by a heterosexual person who would not retain it in his possession.

21. [redacted] AFP, was not questioned as to why he failed to report the homosexual advances made by [redacted], para 4(e) of the original report refers. It has since been learned that [redacted] had requested his release and that this request has been approved by Stn Val D'Or authorities.

22. Further investigative action regarding [redacted] is contemplated by this section when the results of the interviews with [redacted] and [redacted], para 26 of the original report refers, are made known.

1. Forwarded in eleven (11) copies, 14 Apr 66.
2. The results of the psychiatric examinations of [redacted] and [redacted] by S/L P GAMACHE, Med/MD were not available to the investigators. It is understood the psychiatric reports relative to [redacted] were forwarded to CFB Bagotville, their parent Unit.
3. From further information obtained from [redacted] with reference to any additional homosexual acts he might have had, it is felt that the original grounds for suspicion of homosexual acts on the part of [redacted] have been dispelled. There now appears to be no justification for suspicion of homosexual acts by [redacted].
4. This investigation is pending the receipt of the results of previously requested interviews in our report dated 24 Mar 66.
