1. In accordance with SIU letter ES110-8-65(CIO) dated 21 Apr 66 and with reference to SIS North Bay ES110-1-65 dated 24 Mar 66 and 14 Apr 66, our ES110-1-65 is reopened to investigate suspected homosexual tendencies on the part of [redacted] of [redacted] I Tech A, BWO, CFB St Hubert.

26 Apr - 19 May 66

2. On 26 Apr 66 the CO, CFB St Hubert, was informed of the allegations made against [redacted] and his permission to interview [redacted] was requested. Permission to interview [redacted] was granted and he was interviewed the same afternoon.

3. [redacted] was duly cautioned and he denied having homosexual tendencies. He stated that he was aware of the investigation into homosexual activities at CFB Val D'Or and suspected that his name had been mentioned by [redacted]. He then admitted knowing some homosexuals and finally intimated that he was inclined to homosexual tendencies but that he had so far controlled these tendencies. [redacted] then stated that he wished to consult with a priest before continuing with the interview.

4. The following morning (27 Apr) [redacted] flatly denied any homosexual activity. He was again duly cautioned and insisted that any homosexual tendency he may have was well under control. [redacted] appeared very tense and emotionally upset and finally stated that he wished to consult a friend before continuing with the interview.

5. Shortly after W/C R POULIER, SCRA/RC, ADCHL, advised that [redacted] was severely upset and physically ill and that he had taken him to the Stn Hospital.

6. [redacted] was admitted to Stn Hospital on 27 Apr, interviewed by S/L F GAGACHE, Med/MO, on 28 Apr, and admitted to Queen Mary Hospital in Montreal on 29 Apr. S/L Gachache diagnosed sexual deviation and recommended treatment prior to release in accordance with CAFAC C19.00/17. The subject's condition prevented further interview at this time.

7. The subject was interviewed at the Queen Mary Hospital on 5 May 66 and admitted to a few isolated incidents of homosexuality during his service in the RCAF. Most incidents were with civilians and a few with dependants (not identified) at Cold Lake and overseas. [redacted] stated that he knew he had homosexual tendencies which he kept repressed but for a few incidents

and related that he had planned to seek psychiatric assistance as he felt he was losing his self-control. In the last two or three months he made several advances to an airman, [redacted], ATCA, CFB St Hubert, who passively resisted all his advances.

8. [redacted] was interviewed on 6 May 66 and admitted that LAC Boucher had made advances on three or four occasions and that he rejected the advances on every occasion. This did not alter his friendship with [redacted] since he felt that he could control him easily and their friendship was otherwise agreeable.

9. [redacted] was interviewed on 19 May 66 by Major JM Reid, BMO, Base Hospital, who reported that the subject showed no abnormal sexual tendencies and was not an homosexual. Major Reid concluded that psychiatric investigation was not required.

10. No other persons presently in the Canadian Forces were named by [redacted]. Therefore this investigation is concluded here.
