1. Further to this Section's report of even file dated 12 Aug 65.
2. On the 2 Jun 66, [redacted] CFB Clinton appeared before Judge F COSTELLO, County Court Session, Toronto and he was charged jointly with [redacted], High School Teacher, residing at [redacted] Toronto with "Committing an act of Cross Indecency with each other", contrary to Section 149 of the Criminal Code. [redacted] pleaded not guilty and they were represented by Mr ND McCREA AND GG McKEOWN, lawyers for [redacted] respectively. The crown presented evidence that [redacted] had oral copulation with [redacted] and after hearing the evidence, Judge F COSTELLO stated that there was a certain amount of discrepancy in the evidence in relation to the identification of [redacted] on the night of the 18 Jul 65 and as the result, he had no alternative but to acquit [redacted]. He added that as the result of [redacted] S acquittal [redacted] would also be acquitted. [redacted] CFB Clinton was in the court as the Attending Officer.
3. On completion of the court hearing and as the result of instructions received, [redacted] was interviewed concerning his associates. He made a statement under caution and a copy is attached as Annex "A" to this report. On being questioned concerning the reason he locked his wallet containing his identification and other credentials in the trunk of his car prior to visiting the Yorkville area in Toronto, he replied that he had some items of clothing stolen from his car whilst in Florida, USA and he was now in the habit of locking personal documents in his car before visiting the Yorkville area and any other dubious areas in the Toronto area.
4. [redacted] stated that he had no contact with homosexuals during his service in the RCAF and prior to his enlistment, however, on being further questioned, [redacted] admitted that he was involved in an incident when he was about 18 years of age. At this time he had been swimming in Lake Erie about one mile from his home at Dunnville, Ontario, on leaving the water, he was approached by a male person and as this male had oral copulation with [redacted], [redacted] stated that he did not know this person by name and could not give any other information concerning the incident.
5. With reference to the person named [redacted] mentioned in his statement, inquiries have established that this person is :-
 - a. [redacted] Single, Born [redacted], New Glasgow, N.S.
address [redacted]
Employed as a School Teacher, at the Adult Training Centre, Toronto, former employment, civilian instructor, RCAF Staff College, Toronto during the period [redacted].


