2. On 28 Apr 78, a letter of request was received from Maj HINBURY requesting investigative assistance concerning an allegation made against [REDACTED] that she was a lesbian. A copy of the letter of request is attached to this report as Annex "A".

3. At 1320 hrs, 3 May 78, I interviewed [REDACTED] in the presence of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] provided the following information:

- a. she stated she had no regular boy friend;
- b. that she never had any contacts with lesbians other than in [REDACTED] in 1975 when she was aware that some servicewomen were lesbians;
- c. that in [REDACTED], while attending evening courses at the [REDACTED], she became friends with [REDACTED] who was also taking courses;
- d. she had had sexual relations with [REDACTED] four or five times between Oct and Dec 77;
- e. in Dec 77, [REDACTED] introduced her to his wife as she [REDACTED] suspected that her husband was having an extra-marital relationship;
- f. she visited [REDACTED] and his wife on numerous occasions thereafter;
- g. in the first part of Feb 78, [REDACTED] his wife [REDACTED] and she had engaged in a sexual relationship at her residence, however, she had not made love to [REDACTED] and did not have homosexual relations with his wife;
- h. on a later date in Feb 78, [REDACTED] decided she wanted to go to Canada as she was no longer willing to put up fighting with her husband. Consequently, [REDACTED]'s assistance was requested by [REDACTED] in an effort to save his marriage. [REDACTED] was present during the subsequent conversation between [REDACTED] and his wife;

- j. [redacted] stayed at her residence ([redacted]'s) about four times before returning to Canada and that they had no homosexual relations although they slept in the same bed; and
- k. she never had any homosexual relations with her roommate, [redacted], or any other female.
4. At 1010 hrs, 4 May 78, I interviewed [redacted]. The main points of this interview are as follows:
- a. in mid Feb 78, he was contacted by [redacted] and asked to come to [redacted]'s home as his wife wanted to leave him and he needed counselling;
- b. while he was at [redacted]'s residence, [redacted] arrived;
- c. [redacted] and his wife explained that they, together with [redacted], had engaged in a sexual act. During this encounter, [redacted] had engaged in a homosexual act. [redacted] then decided to leave her husband as she had fallen in love with ([redacted]);
- d. [redacted] went to Canada for 2 weeks and on her return, had numerous separate counselling sessions with [redacted];
- e. during these counselling sessions, [redacted] admitted that she was a lesbian. [redacted] therefore asked [redacted] to stay away from the [redacted] family as [redacted] held a Secret security clearance and homosexuality was not permitted in the CAF;
- f. [redacted] related to him that before her marriage she had had homosexual relations. [redacted] asked her to forget about [redacted] and to try to mend her marriage;
- g. [redacted] continued to meet at [redacted]'s residence;
- h. he made [redacted] aware of [redacted]'s activities;
- j. [redacted] agreed with [redacted] that his wife should seek help from [redacted] in order to save their marriage; and
- k. in his opinion, [redacted] had made up her mind that she would not stay with her husband, that she loved [redacted] wanted to live with her and be a lesbian rather than a wife and mother.

5. At 0940 hrs, 5 May 78, I interviewed [REDACTED] The following information was related to me:

- a. [REDACTED] came to him and stated that she was there at her husband's request only;
- b. that she was in love with another woman, she wanted to leave her husband and she wanted to know if there was anything wrong with her actions;
- c. [REDACTED] did not ask who this other woman was or whether she was a servicewoman; and
- d. he also spoke to [REDACTED] who wanted to know if it was his fault that his wife had become a homosexual.

[REDACTED] would not reveal the answers he gave to the questions asked by [REDACTED] and his wife.

6. At 1035 hrs, 5 May 78, I interviewed [REDACTED] in the presence of [REDACTED]. A voluntary statement was written by me on [REDACTED]'s request as he dictated it to me on 8 May 78. A copy of the voluntary statement is attached to this report as Annex "B". The main points of the interview and of the statement are as follows:

- a. he met [REDACTED] while taking evening courses at the [REDACTED]. He took her out a few times. In Nov-Dec 77, they mutually masturbated and performed cunnilingus about three or four times. [REDACTED] refused to make love stating she could not take a man's penis;
- b. as a result of guilt feelings toward his wife for his actions, he informed her of his relationship with [REDACTED]. To prove to her that he did not love [REDACTED] he suggested bringing [REDACTED] home;
- c. he and [REDACTED] did not have further sexual relations and [REDACTED] visited him and his wife on a regular basis;
- d. on the evening of 3 Feb 78, after having had some drinks at [REDACTED]'s residence, [REDACTED], his wife and he ended up in [REDACTED]'s bed. He tried to make love to [REDACTED] and she refused;
- e. on the evening of 4 Feb 78, the three of them went to bed again. He tried to make love to [REDACTED] but she refused stating she had never made love to a man and would never do it as she was a lesbian. She also told him that she had been initiated at the age of 14 by a nun named [REDACTED] while attending school at a convent in Quebec. He then

made love to his wife and when he was finished, his wife and [redacted] started to fondle and kiss each other after which they mutually performed cunnilingus. [redacted] left and returned about 15 minutes later and asked them to stop. They stopped but did not get dressed right away;

- f. he attended the [redacted] from the 6 Feb to 9 Feb 78 and returned home every evening. On Thursday evening, 9 Feb 78, his wife told him that for three afternoons in a row, 7, 8 and 9 Feb 78, [redacted] and her had made love together. He tried to tell his wife that she was getting too involved but soon realized it was too late;
 - g. during the evening of 10 Feb 78, his wife begged him to get [redacted], which he did, and after they had talked together for about five to ten minutes, they decided to go to [redacted]'s residence, leaving him with his two children;
 - h. on Saturday evening, 11 Feb 78, he went to [redacted]'s residence to get his wife. She would not come home with him, however, [redacted] drove his wife home later in the night;
 - j. on Sunday, 12 Feb 78, he spoke to his wife about the whole affair and suggested to his wife that she should go to Canada to reassess the situation. She agreed;
 - k. he then called [redacted] who arranged for his wife's return to Canada on 13 Feb 78 as [redacted] agreed that [redacted] needed some time to think;
 - m. after his wife's return from Canada on 28 Feb 78, he and his wife had several private counselling sessions with [redacted]. These sessions did not stop his wife and [redacted] visiting each other;
 - n. [redacted] his wife and [redacted] then agreed that [redacted] should see [redacted]. After a visit with [redacted] his wife seemed to be more determined to carry on her relationship with [redacted];
 - p. at this time, he and his wife agreed on a separation. His wife returned to Canada leaving him with the two children.
7. [redacted] could not be interviewed at this time as she is in [redacted] however, she will be interviewed on her return.

8. As it is apparent that [redacted] did not tell the truth during her interview, she will be re-interviewed on her return from a six week voluntary [redacted] [redacted] departed for CFB Trenton on 4 May 78.

9. In summary, the following points are noted:

- a. as a result of the marriage breakdown between [redacted] and his wife and the relationship between [redacted] it was alleged that [redacted] is a lesbian;
- b. [redacted] was interviewed and denied being a lesbian;
- c. [redacted] has confirmed that [redacted] and [redacted] have told him that they are lesbians and had engaged in homosexual activities together on numerous occasions;
- d. [redacted] stated that he has seen his wife and [redacted] having homosexual relations and that they told him that they are lesbians; and
- e. [redacted] and his wife have separated as a result of his wife's and [redacted]'s homosexual activities.

10. [redacted] has in his possession a letter written to him by his wife prior to her leaving for Canada in Apr 78. This letter, along with the results of the interviews with [redacted] and [redacted], will be included in our next report. Since [redacted] will not return to her Unit prior to mid Jun 78, this file has been given an extended diary date.


