

point that is made clear is that those persons not handling classified material are nevertheless, in some instances (how many, we don't know) quite friendly with people in the Government service who do have a higher classification and with a view to cultivating this friendship it was felt that more information could be obtained without directing suspicion against the recruitment of the individual that I have referred to.

2. This is very much in line with the thinking of this Directorate in dealing with persons who do not require access to classified material that they are not out of danger from our point of view in being recruited because they may have friends who have access to classified material.

- 3. I bring this point to attention as it may be of some assistance to us in our thinking when dealing with this whole question.
- 4. I do not wish to make this memorandum in several copies but I would appreciate it if you would have Inspector Milligan and Inspector Draper note my remarks and if they should so wish they could see the recent document that I referred to and keep it in mind when carrying out their respective duties in the field of vetting for Government positions and in particular the upgrading of individuals for higher classification in the Government service.
