Requirements - Special Research Team

1. A continuing supply of male deviant subjects for testing at NDMC — at least 20 to be provided before October 1st, 1965. Source of supply should be confirmed detections in all military establishments, Ottawa area.
2. A control group is needed with a minimum of 20 normal male subjects before October 1st, 1965. Source of these subjects should be the normal discharge roster of military establishments. If feasible, the control group should have roughly the same range as the deviant group in age, education, rank on discharge. An irregular order of appearance of the subjects (i.e. not all deviants, then all controls) is preferable.
3. Co-ordinator of research should be G/C Beach, Chief of Psychiatry, NDMC. Subjects should be referred to him by the military authority and he, in turn, will make arrangements with the research team. It is not necessary for a subject to be identified by name, etc.

to the research team - the Chief of Psychiatry will take note of pertinent information.

4. The NDMC research unit can process subjects at the rate of one a day five days a week, although there is no need to refer subjects at this, or any regular, rate. Maximum testing time for a subject is half a day.

5. Research procedure includes physiological tests, psychological tests and medical examination.

6. The research unit is prepared to begin as soon as the first subject is available. In most instances, testing can be arranged on very short notice.

7. In addition to the male subjects, the research unit is anxious to test as many deviant female subjects as possible with a corresponding, but somewhat larger, control group of normal females (the two groups to be roughly of the same age, rank, etc.).

8. It might be particularly helpful if the military authority in charge of the disposal of all cases of detected deviance in the Ottawa area, could ensure that said cases are referred to the Chief of Psychiatry, NDMC for testing.
