

1. As a result of Ref A I forwarded to CSIS, at Ref B, your request for them to provide a security risk assessment of homosexuals. Yesterday, I reminded CSIS that a reply had not yet been received. [REDACTED] A/DG Security Screening informed me that he was not prepared to commit to paper anything on this subject.

2. However, [REDACTED] did verbally state that homosexuals present no greater risk to security than heterosexuals providing their life-style is open. Herein lies the problem with the CF. Because of our administrative policies, homosexuals are often forced to live a hidden lifestyle which then increases their vulnerability to coercion.

3. There are a number of admitted homosexuals (to DSC only) serving in the CF who hold security clearances. Only one, in recent memory, has had her security clearance revoked. The case involved a female member who accessed, without authority, a classified file on her lesbian lover and passed on to her the contents of the file.
